

Teach Us to Pray – "Lead Us Not Into Temptation"

Matthew 6:13

We need to persistently pray for righteous paths and divine protection.

- A trial is meant to develop you, but a temptation is meant to destroy you.
- Often our greatest temptations come within the trials that God allows in our lives.
- We're praying for God to empower us to pass safely through the testing of our faith.

Scriptural Thoughts for Application

- To truly follow means we need to focus on the one leading us. (Hebrews. 4:14-16, 12:1-3)
- Desire wrapped in deception leads to disobedience and ends in destruction. (Colossians 2:8; Ephesians 6:10-18)
- God's priority isn't to make us happy, it's to make us holy. (James 1:2-4; Galatians 2:20)
- Jesus invites us to walk ahead into the darkness and discover that it, too, belongs to God. (Matthew 16:18-19, 28:18-20)

Memory Verse:

"And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil." - Matthew 6:13 (ESV)

Other Scripture: 1 Corinthians 10:13; Luke 11:4, 22:40; James 1:13-18; 1 Peter 4:12; 2 Peter 2:9; 1 Timothy 6:9; Galatians 5:16; Hebrews 2:18; Psalm 119:11

Further Study:
