The Law, the Gospel, and the Power to Walk

Galatians 2:15-20, 3:23-29, 4:1-7, 5:16-23

After we're set free in the gospel, we get to live free in the gospel.

- We're all tempted to put our hope in a gospel of our own goodness.
- The purpose of the law is to point us to the person of Jesus. (*Galatians 2:19*)
- In Christ, the version of you who needed to prove their goodness is put to death. (*Galatians 2:20*)
- In Christ, our attempt at goodness has been replaced by the ultimate goodness of Jesus. (*Galatians 2:20*)
- We are adopted into the family of God through what we believe, not by how we behave. (*Galatians 3:26*)
- We are saved by the power of God and we live by the power of God. (*Galatians 4:6; 5:16-23*)

Questions to Discuss

- Remember a situation where you've been living "under the law." How could that situation be different as you live by faith and under grace?
- How can we increasingly submit to the Spirit's leading in our everyday lives?

Memory Verse:

“For freedom Christ has set us free; stand firm therefore, and do not submit again to a yoke of slavery.” – Galatians 5:1 (ESV)

Other Scripture: Romans 3:20, 4:13-15, 15:13; Acts 13:39; 1 Timothy 1:8-10; Ephesians 2:15

Further Study:

Read: Galatians 2:15-20, 3:23-29, 4:1-7, 5:16-23 in your group or with at least one other person.

1. Have someone read it while everyone reads along.
2. Have someone else read it while everyone else listens.
3. Have someone recount the text from memory in their own words.

Discuss:

1. What does the passage reveal about God?
2. What does the passage reveal about humanity?

Act:

1. If this passage is from God, what should change about how you live?
2. Who needs to hear the truth of this Scripture that you can share it with this week?
Identify a time this week when you might have the opportunity to share with them.
