

Big Idea: Forgive from your heart because God poured out his love on the cross.

Who can forgive?

God is a forgiver.

- God covers our sins.
- God doesn't count our sins against us.
- · God removes our sins.
- God sweeps away our sins like a morning mist.
- God ends the threat of punishment and wrath.
- God didn't just say, "I forgive you." God put forward Jesus as a sacrifice.

Propitiation: Means of forgiveness, location or place where sins are forgiven. God's forgiveness is a gracious gift to sinners.

"Father forgive them, for they know not what they do."

God offers forgiveness when we don't even know we need it or know what we are doing.

God is a good father that gives abundantly to us.

Who can forgive?

- Union with Jesus makes a way for us to be set free.
- We have been moved from sinners to ambassadors.
- If you are still keeping count, you haven't really forgiven them at all.
- Remember how much you've been forgiven.
- If your heart is open to forgive others, it will be open to receive God's love, grace, and forgiveness.
