We all need a Kinsman Redeemer.

BIG Idea: Jesus is our Kinsman Redeemer.

God's plans for redeeming others includes you.

Don't mistake God's patient plans for His absence or His abandonment.

God is always with you. He is always for you. He is always at work on your behalf. He always loves you.

Reflection Time:

Trinity's Core Values:

- Gospel Transformation: Jesus alone changes lives.
- Humble Dependence: Apart from God we can do nothing.
- Sacrificial Living: Giving up our way for His way.
- Relational Discipleship: Following Jesus together.
- Cultural Engagement: Showing and sharing the love of Jesus.

How did you see the 5 core values in the story of Ruth, Naomi, and Boaz? Try to think of a couple specific examples.

Pray. Ask God to show you where and with whom he wants you to live out one or more of the core values in this coming week.

What can you give up, where can you give in, when or how can you give to others so that you build bridges and loving relationships?

Further Study:
