Psalm 103

"Our attempt at exposition is commenced under an impressive sense of the utter impossibility of doing justice to so sublime a composition; we call upon our soul and all that is within us to aid in the pleasurable task; but, alas, our soul is finite, and our all of mental faculty far too little for the enterprise. Three Reasons to Remember:

- 1. His glory is for our good. (vv. 1-5)
- 2. His mercy is our only merit. (vv. 6-18)
- 3. His kingdom is our calling, (vv. 19-22)
