
REVISIT/REVIEW/REVIVE

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Trinity has been spending Summer in the Psalms to encourage us in our faith walk. One of the prominent themes in David's psalms is revisiting and reviewing God's past faithfulness to him and, through this, the shepherd king is revived and expectant of God's continued goodness for the future. As 1 Samuel 30:6 says "David encouraged himself in the Lord his God". When we consider events in our church's early days we can employ that example and move confidently into Tomorrow for Trinity. Let's revisit and review together.

Our roots are intrinsically connected to a godly widow used by the Holy Spirit in the mid-1940's. Sadie Sneller was told by her doctor that she had a year to live and her response was to pray "Lord, may this year count for you. Give me something hard to do." God then put it on her heart to "Go and reach the young people...." She had been involved in mission work in downtown Minneapolis and knew the pitfalls that those young people would face and didn't want another generation to fall into a life of struggle and sin. Her compassion was for the youth of the Orchard Gardens area, which is now incorporated into Lakeville. After prayer with her sons, Sadie felt that she should establish this ministry along Lyndale Ave (currently County Road 5) because electric lights would be available there. She was led to reach out to Christina Huddleston, a resident of the area who had a small store on the corner of County Rds 5 and 46. God had given Sadie a dream one night of the site for her future ministry. She had been shown a knoll with tall grass around tombstones and trees. She went to Christina and shared this dream, after which Mrs. Huddleston took her to the living quarters behind the store. She pulled back a curtain to reveal a grass knoll with tombstones and trees. It was just as Sadie had described. Additionally Christina told her the land adjacent to the cemetery was donated several years earlier by her parents, the Streeflands, to a group whose intent was to build a church on the property. That project was never accomplished but the land and money raised by the group were still intact if the Lord would give Sadie favor with these people. Gloriously this was the result and the land and financial bonds were transferred to the Victorious Life Sunday School. The fruit of Sadie's own victorious life would then, through several transitions, many more glory 210th Street, become Trinity stories ultimately а move to Church today. Let us likewise encourage ourselves in the Lord our God.

What if our Youth program was expanded with greater reach and connectedness to Lakeville South? What if the expanded children and youth outreach was used to connect more families to Trinity and to the Gospel? The answer: more salvation stories and baptisms. That is what excites me - rejoicing together as a church family as people get saved and we praise God together at baptism services. I look forward to many of these celebrations in our future!
